As I write this to you, it is less than 24 hours since my beloved Dad has passed away. Hans Philipp (known to many as Papi) was almost 93 years old and had a most amazing life. Born in Berlin, Germany in 1914, he managed to help his parents escape to Colombia in 1939. There, he would start from scratch, learn a new language, support his parents and start a family. The youngest of Hans's three children, I was born in Bogota in 1959 and lived there until my parents moved the family to Vancouver in 1969. The political turmoil in Colombia posed many challenges and Canada offered a wonderful opportunity. Once here, Hans's main goal was to provide education and stability for his family. And that he accomplished very well!

Hans had an uncanny ability to touch people in a most positive way. During the last months of his life, which he spent in Weinberg Residence and Louis Brier Home, he became a very active part of the communities there despite being blind and having difficulty walking. The nurses refer to him as the kind gentleman who always found a way to make people smile, and who always found a way to overcome his own difficulties with a positive attitude. The caring staff at the Weinberg and Louis Brier made each day very special.

We were fortunate to spend so much quality time with Papi during his life, and we have no regrets. Even in the last few months, he was rarely alone. We tried to fill his life with as much meaning as possible, which is what he always did for us.

As we approach a new year, it seems like an opportune time to review relationships and priorities: are we making enough time for the people and things that matter? It's never too late to make those small changes that will let us do that, and to be more thoughtful of those loved ones around us.

On behalf of my family, both immediate and extended, we wish you the very best for the coming High Holy Days. May we all be inscribed in the Book of Life for a healthy and sweet New Year.

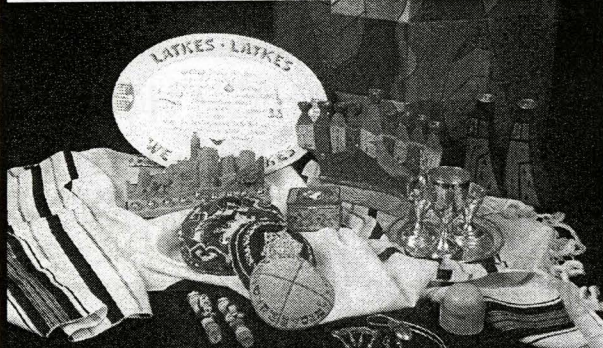

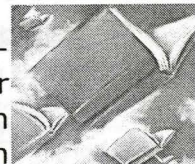

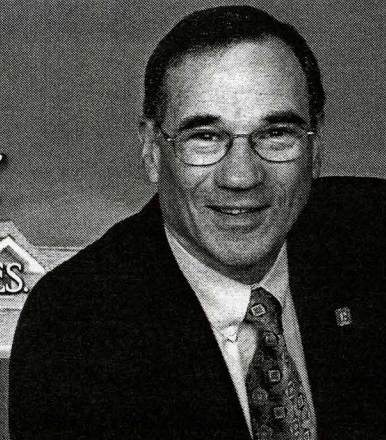

the Healing of the Soul

Yom Kippur Means Always Having to Say You're Sorry

The Ten Days of Awe, which comprise the High Holy Day period within Judaism, include Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. During this time, Jews have an opportunity to reflect on the previous year and ask forgiveness for their sins.

The Hebrew word for "sin" is "chet," an archery term that literally means "missing the mark." This exposes an important difference between the Christian and Jewish concepts of sin. Jews do not subscribe to the concept of original sin - the notion that everyone is born sinful as a result of the transgression made by Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. Instead Jews believe that each person is born innocent. Judaism also believes that each person is responsible only for his or her own mistakes or sins.

To a Jew, sinning means going astray, not following through or losing focus. Certainly lack of honesty or integrity is considered sinful, as is ignoring or contradicting Jewish laws. But an unconscious or accidental omission or slight can also be considered sinful. Jewish sin isn't just what you do, it can even be what you don't do. For example, walking by someone in need can be considered a sin because of the missed opportunity to do a good deed.

Within Judaism, there are three ways of sinning: sinning against God (making a vow that you don't keep or violating a ritual law), sinning against another person (acting illegally, hurtfully or deceitfully) and sinning against yourself (hiding behind addictive behaviour or bringing harm to yourself). While Yom Kippur stresses atonement for the sins against God, the High Holy Days as a whole encourage people to focus on all three types of sin, providing an opportunity for them to actively seek and extend forgiveness so that everyone can act with greater integrity and truthfulness in the coming year.

Jewish tradition identifies three stages in the process of forgiveness, whether you are being forgiven or are forgiving others. The steps are identified by the Hebrew words "selichah" meaning forgiveness, "m'chilah" meaning "letting go," and "kaparah" which means "atonement."

Forgiveness begins with the conscious intention

to forgive. But if the process ends there, the feelings of guilt or resentment reappear when you least expect them. Letting go entails releasing those negative feelings. At this stage, you may remember the pain but you are no longer consumed either with guilt or resentment. With atonement, you can accomplish something positive that otherwise wouldn't have been possible. While you still remember, and may still feel the pain from the transgression, the act of atonement transforms the hurt into a more productive emotion.

When most people hear the word "repentance," they think of a system in which some authority figure absolves people of their sins. In Judaism, however, there is no such authority. Jewish tradition clearly states that Yom Kippur offers forgiveness from God if - and only if - you have both repented and atoned for any wrongs. The Hebrew word for "repentance" is "teshuvah," which signifies a psychological or emotional "turning", resulting in a retargeting of your life.

Atonement requires taking action so that you can make amends for any wrongdoing. To truly atone, you have to make an effort to fix whatever you have broken. Just apologizing isn't enough; you have to find a way to make reparation. The Talmud states that you can't just go out and sin with the understanding that you'll be forgiven by God on Yom Kippur. You can't circumvent the important work of reconciliation with yourself, your family, your neighbours, and so on. Ultimately, the point of all this is to change, to grow, and to develop. In fact, the ancient rabbis taught that full repentance only comes when you have a second opportunity to commit a sin, but choose to behave differently.

5. Say the shechecheyanu together.

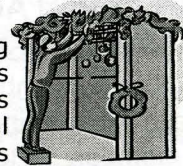
6. Make a mark on the wall to see how much you have grown since last year (with permission). Guess how tall you will be at your Bar or Bat Mitzvah.

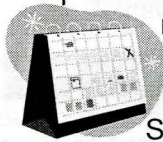

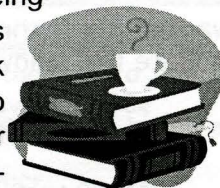

ANNOUNCING TEMPLE SHOLOM'S ENDOWMENT FUND ALLOCATIONS

In helping others, we shall help ourselves; for whatever good we give out completes the circle and comes back to us.

The Temple Sholom Endowment Committee is pleased to announce the projects that have been awarded funds through our first ever Endowment allocation. In total \$9,200 will be dispersed to facilitate the following initiatives:

\$500 to cover start-up costs for creating and developing a manual to help B'nai Mitzvah families implement and choose their "mitzvah" projects.

\$1200 towards the cost of setting up a "Naomi Project". The proposed "Naomi Project" is designed to provide assistance to those individuals in Rabbi Bregman's Jewish Information Class (JIC) and for Temple Sholom members who have chosen to live a Jewish life. Support will be provided by a trained group of mentors in the form of conversations, general information material, workshops, and field trips. Endowment funds will be used to offset the cost of tuition and airfare for a Temple member in order that she may attend the "Outreach Fellows Program for Conversion Certification" at HUC-JIR in Cincinnati.

\$2500 towards the cost of engaging a "scholar-in-residence" for an upcoming Temple Sholom retreat at Camp Kalsman in Washington State. This funding will assist in offsetting the cost of participation for Temple members.

\$5000 towards the cost of setting up the broadcast of Shabbat Services to housebound congregants. A video and sound system is being installed in our Temple sanctuary in order to broadcast Friday night and Saturday morning services to housebound seniors via the Internet. Congregants who are unable to attend services due to advanced age or poor health will be supplied with everything they need to experience Shabbat Services as they occur without leaving their homes. In addition, members of Temple who are away at school or out of town for other reasons, who cannot be in Vancouver to celebrate a family Bar/Bat Mitzvah, have been identified as also being potential beneficiaries of this program. This system will hopefully be up and running by September 2007.

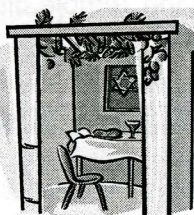

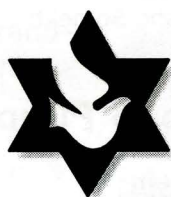

A SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM THE RABBI

I am very pleased to announce that on Friday, August 31, 2007 we inaugurated a new program for members of the Synagogue.

Beginning with that Friday night service we began broadcasting all regular and High Holy Days services live on the internet, both pictures and sound.

This new outreach program has been in the works for over a year now, and all of the technical details have been worked out.

There are several potential types of congregants who can take advantage of this service, however the original "target" audience was, and still is, congregants who are unable to attend services any longer for reasons of health or age. The system, in its full form, will allow those congregants who fit into this category to watch the services on their home TV sets, **with absolutely no requirement to know about computers.** The system we have designed (for those individuals who don't have a computer) uses a specially designed computer which receives the video and sound feed from the Temple over the Internet and transfers it to their TV sets. All that is normally required of the user is to push one button on their TV remotes to receive the programs.

There are also a number of types of users who would wish to watch services on their computers. Examples of this might be:

1. Members of the Congregation who are travelling, or who cannot attend personally for whatever reason.
2. Family members of Bar and Bat Mitzvah families who cannot attend in person and who wish to see the service. (We have already successfully tested this with family members of a recent Bat Mitzvah who live out of town and were unable to be here in person.)

There will be strict logon and password control systems in place for this system so that each congregant who wishes access must get the login and passwords from the office. The passwords will change from time to time.

Those who fall into the category of our primary target group will need to apply for the service. There is a one time cost for purchase of the internet modem, and the ``little black box`` which the Temple will supply. In addition, there is the monthly cost of the internet service.

For those members of the congregation who qualify for the full service on their TV sets, and therefore require the equipment and internet service, and who cannot afford the cost, there is a subsidy program in place to cover these costs. (I want to let you know that we now have a "Web-Cast Fund" at the Shul to help pay for these subsidies).


For those who can (or whose family can) afford these costs, there are a number of payment options available.

Please contact the office for application forms for the service if you wish the full TV system including internet service and the little black box required and a form will be sent to you.

This project has been the brain-child of Al Simmons, and we cannot thank him enough for not only the idea, but for the hundreds and hundreds of hours he has spent in bringing this to fruition.

You'll be hearing more about this program in the months to come. For now we want to let you know that it exists and is available upon request.
