

## FROM THE RABBI

Judaism can best be described as a religion of doing, not just thinking. Belief, while important, must be accompanied by action in order to make the concepts real. We physically abstain from eating on Yom Kippur as one of the ways of demonstrating our intention of repenting. We also are required to literally ask forgiveness from the individual or individuals whom we have wronged. It is not enough to sit in the synagogue and ask God.

One of the holy days which best demonstrates the requirement for action, is the one which follows Yom Kippur, namely Sukkot. How do we say thankyou to God the the harvest, and for the food. Words are not enough. We have at our finger tips a wonderful tradition of participation, and one that I suspect very few Jewish homes engage in the building of a Sukka. Have you ever done it? Would you ever consider doing it? Taking the time to plan, to organize and to actually build a Sukka, is what Judaism subscribes for this festival as a way of giving thanks to God. Building a frail hut, decorating it, and then eating some meals in it, is far different than just uttering words of thanks. The erecting of a Sukka requires a different type of effort.

Perhaps your are not sure how to build a Sukka and need some assistance, or even more to the point, some company. AS a congregational family we need to reach out and open our homes and hearts to one another. If you would like to build a Sukka with another family, call the synagogue office and give us your name and we will attempt to put families together for this wonderful religious project.

Judaism is a religion of doing and Sukkot is a marvelous way to begin the New Year by demonstrating our thanks in more than just words.

The Canadian Council of Reform Judaism has formulated a position paper on the constitutional proposals, which is the first detailed position paper on a matter of Canadian public policy ever put forth by the Canadian Reform Community.

A summary of this response is detailed here.

## SUMMARY OF OUR **RESPONSE TO BEAUDOIN-DOBBIE**

1. We support the proposed clause of the Canada Clause interpretive in effect - which invokes "recognition of the irreplaceable value of our multicultural heritage".

2. We support the recommendation of the Anti-Defamation League of the B'nai B'rith cited in the Beaudoin-Dobbie report that section 27 of the Charter be amended in a way that would explicitly articulate the promotion of racial equality.

3. We support the Beaudoin-Dobbie report in making special mention in the Canada Clause of the "abiding obligation to

assure the equality of women and men".

4. To the prohibited grounds of discrimination specified in section 15 of the Charter we would add, where the Beaudoin-Dobbie report is silent, the ground of "sexual orientation" to give constitutional entrenchment to rights already recognized in part through court precedents.

5. We support the report's recognition of Quebec's special responsibilities mentioned in the Canada Clause and the additional distinct society clause whose insertion is proposed following section 25 of the Charter. We would add our voice to that of Canadian Jewish Congress and point out that Quebec's distinctiveness should be seen to include a

multicultural and multi-racial demography.

6. We support the recognition of an inherent right to self-government on the part of Aboriginal peoples. Our preference, subject to Aboriginal consent, is for the exercise of this right to proceed in a Canadian context and with an accomodation to the Canadian Charter. We would suggest that Aboriginal people have some representation on Supreme Court Decisions affecting customary rights; that Aboriginal women have formal representation in the process of working out the implications of accomodating self-government to the Canadian judicial and political system.

7. We support the inclusion of a social and environmental covenant on the assumption that the necessities of food, shelter, health care and a livable environment are not merely goals but rights and their provision are community obligations.

8. We support an elected Senate with more equitable regional representation and with an Aboriginal component, operating as an effective body of legislative review and whose rejection of House of Commons' legislation could only be overridden by a 'more than simple majority' in the latter chamber.

9. We support the removal of the legislative override clause (section 33) of the Charter with the caveat that Canadians need to be especially vigilant in overseeing the process of judicial appointment to the Supreme Court.


