Dear Harry:

I have your undated letter this morning and this is the first communication I have had from you on this subject.

I object very much to the general tone of your letter and also to the insinuation that your purchase of a half-unit in the McLean Group was done as a charitable act. I sold you something that was in the nature of a speculation and had some work been done on this group, or a deal been made, or had the price of these units appreciated, the benefit certainly would have been yours. I have had the half-unit which belongs to you in my possession for some time and it was only through neglect that same is not in your hands. It is enclosed herewith. I feel that this sale was made to you in the same manner as I sold other units to anybody else who participated in the proposition and I can assure you I am not in any position to buy back all the units in the McLean Group, which is just what your request amounts to.

As you know, I interested a great many of my friends in the deal and I think it would be distinctly bad business on my part to go on record as buying back any part of the proposition. However, I am not adverse to lending you \$100. and if you will wire me on receipt of this letter I will be very glad to wire this amount, which you can pay back anytime you get rich, but as outlined above, I feel under no obligation to return your money on any deal made with you in regard to the McLean Group, and as for your letter, I think that you know me well enough to make such remarks as contained therein is rather unnecessary.
