

Victoria January the 18th 1864

To the President of the Hebrew Benevolent
Society San Francisco.

Sir!

In the name of the Congregation Emanuel
of this place, allow me to introduce to your
Benevolent institution our fellow Member
Mr. E. Maimberg, who is about leaving
this Colony for your City in consequence
of having been bereaved of his sight,
and is ^{therefor} pitifully unable to support himself
and Family. The Localities of this place
have done all they could for him by
making ^{the} collections of about \$500. out of
~~this~~ ^{partly} however, he had to pay some Debts
which he owed, You would therefore
confer an obligation upon this Congre-
gation, if you would use your influence
and endeavors towards relieving
the wants of said Mr Maimberg's Family,
as Charity bestowed upon him, could not
be
