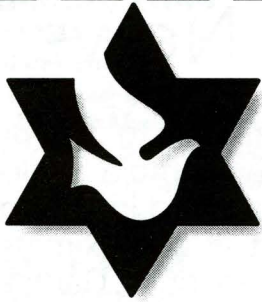

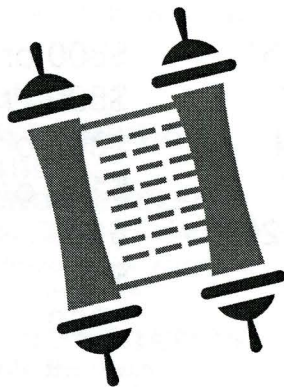

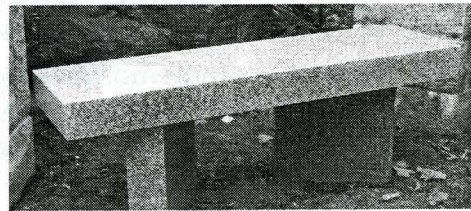

From the Centre for the Healing of the Soul

FAST FOOD FOR THE SOUL

Water has been used for healing throughout history, from ancient temples to modern-day spas to the mikvehs of Jewish tradition. Immersion is a physical act which can also be transformative. A dip in the water can be used to signal a "rebirth" or provide ritual purification of the body and soul. It can make us feel fresh and new, signifying a transition from one state of being to another. When combined with aromatherapy, the healing power of water intensifies, creating both a tactile and olfactory experience. Our skin is our largest sensory organ and from the time we were born, touch has warmed us, protected us and made us feel loved. Our sense of smell is also a powerful force, carrying with it memories of childhood and the images of people, places and things that have been significant to us over the years.

This miniMeditation, which entails immersion in a scented tub of water, is designed to provide a soothing experience directly to your whole body. For this exercise, lavender oil is recommended, as it is the most versatile of all the healing aromatherapy scents, but if another essence appeals to you, feel free to use it instead.

MiniMEDITATION #10: Healing Water

Ingredients:

- A tub of water in a room where you can have some privacy.
- Lavender oil (available at health food stores and retail outlets, such as Escents, that carry bath & body products)
- An alarm clock
- A candle and matches (optional)
- A large, fluffy bath towel

Directions:

- Fill the tub with warm water.
- As the tub is filling, add 12 drops of essential lavender oil to the water. **IMPORTANT NOTE:** If you have sensitive skin or are prone to allergies, add only 8 drops of the essential oil.
- If you wish, turn down the lights in the room and light the candle, making sure to put it in a safe place.
- Set the alarm clock for as long as you like.
- When the tub is full, get in and settle yourself into a comfortable position.
- Now, simply allow yourself to "be." Focus on the present and enjoy the moment. Let the warm water and the delicious scent embrace you. Imagine that whatever needs healing is being comforted and cleansed, washed away by the water that surrounds you.
- When the time comes for you to end the meditation, move thoughtfully. Exit from the tub slowly and carefully. As you dry yourself with the towel, keep in mind that your skin is the boundary between you and the outside world, defining the external limits of your physical self. Treat your body gently and with appreciation, for it is the package that carries your soul through life on this earth.
- Don't forget to extinguish the candle.

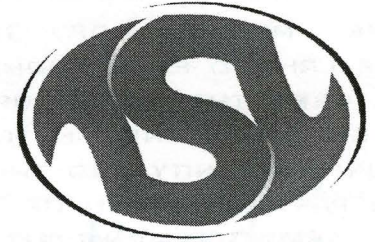
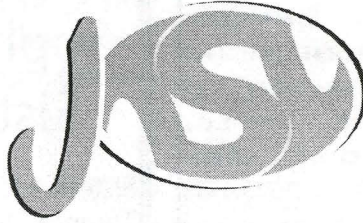
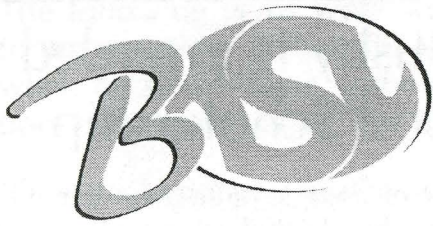

Secretary: Responsible for taking minutes at TSY Board meetings.

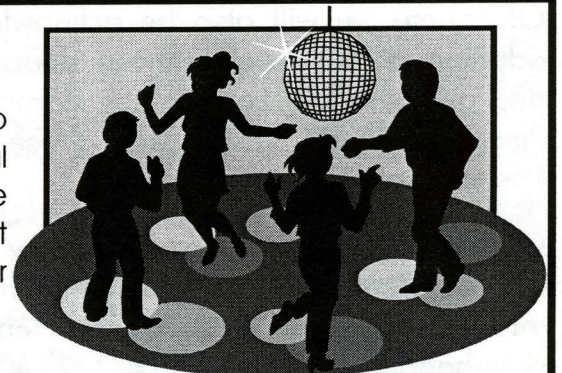
NFTY-Representative: Responsible for advertising NFTY and the liaison between NFTY and TSY

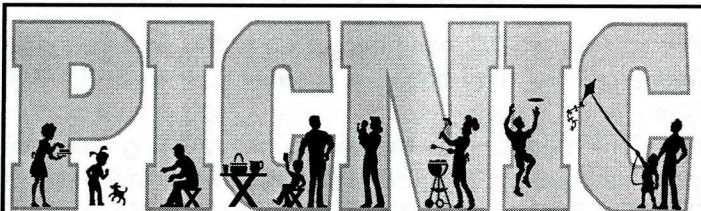

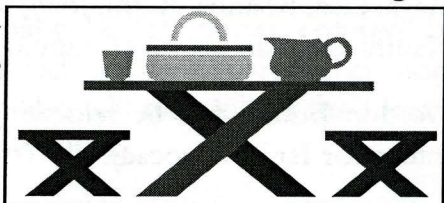

Religious School News

The following gems were written in response to the question - What did Maimonides mean when he said "Prayer without kavanah (intention) is no prayer at all"?

"If you don't open your heart to God, it is not a prayer."

"If you say a prayer without thinking about it, it is not worth saying."

"You need to concentrate to pray, and by concentrating you are linked to God. Without Kavanah, the prayer is just words with no meaning whatsoever."

"He means that if you are saying a prayer and you are chewing gum and also playing with your hands, then that is not a prayer. If you are thinking about the prayer then that is a prayer."

"Prayer needs kavanah to connect with God. It has no meaning if you say a prayer without meaning it or without concentrating on just your prayer."

"If you are not focused on it, it is not very sincere."

"You have to concentrate and mean what you're saying in a prayer, to have kavanah. It has no meaning if you are thinking of something entirely different than the prayer."

"He means that to make a prayer or praying like you really mean to pray, you have to think about what you are saying. It has no meaning if you are thinking about what you are going to do the next day or what you are going to say to your friends."

"You know you have felt kavanah because you just have a feeling that something is clicking between you and God."
