FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

Predictably, our Shul has suffered a fair amount of wear and tear over the years, but just lately there has been a spate of accidental, but avoidable damage to the building; broken glass in the Sanctuary, a broken water-cooler, a microphone pulled out of its socket on the Bimah, a damaged fire door, etc. etc. None of this is major, but it all adds up and everything costs us money to repair. There have also been some rather disturbing acts of vandalism, an example being - an apple deliberately dropped into one of the toilets - causing a major flood in the men's washroom. It cost us a great deal of money and time to have the apple removed and the mess cleaned up.

This is really an appeal to congregants to help us take better care of the building and its contents. The Shul belongs to all of us. It is an exceptionally aesthetically pleasing place to be and we are very proud that it has become a popular venue for events in the Jewish Community. It would be in all of our best interests to maintain it in its present condition by being more aware of what is going on around us; playing an active role in protecting it. Our children need to be made aware of how important this building is to us. They should learn to respect and care for it. Thank you for your co-operation with this.


Left-overs

We ask that if you bring to the Temple, which is something that has become traditional on many occasions throughout the year, that you either bring your food in a container that you no longer want, or mark it in such a way that we can call you. In any case, if it is left here over a period of 30 days, we become attached, and it becomes a part of our kitchen inventory. We know that a lot of these dishes are valuable, and we would like them to be reclaimed. On the other hand, we occasionally have this problem: taken in error? Anne & Eric Andrew have lost a precious Finnish glass plate - large, with an irregular edge. It was a wedding present and they would love to have it back. Please check your cupboards. It is possible this plate looks just like one of yours, but on closer inspection you realize it is not. Thank you for your help with this.
