SUPPLEMENTAL EXAMINATIONS.—Supplementals granted on an examination held in any year must be removed not later than September of the following year. A candidate may remove one or more supplementals at any examination during the period prescribed. If writing only one paper he must obtain 50 per cent. If writing more than one paper he must obtain an average of 50 per cent. and not less than 40 per cent. on any one paper.

Third-year Course, Commercial, candidates may remove Supplementals in purely Commercial subjects in June only. They may remove Supplementals which correspond to Junior Matriculation subjects in either June or September.

Every candidate for a supplemental examination in June or September is required to fill out the application form and return it, with the necessary fee, to the Registrar of the DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, VICTORIA, B.C., at least ONE MONTH before the commencement of the examination.

September supplemental examinations are held at The University of British Columbia (Vancouver), Victoria College (Victoria), and in the High Schools at Kamloops, Kelowna, Nanaimo, Nelson, Prince George, Prince Rupert, and Revelstoke.

A request for the re-reading of an answer paper must be forwarded to the Department of Education within two weeks after the results of the examination are announced. Each applicant must state clearly his reasons for making such a request in view of the fact that the paper of a candidate who makes less than 40 per cent, in a subject is read at least a second time before results are tabulated and announced. The fee for re-reading a paper is \$2.
