

Victoria April 30th 1862

Dear Morris

Yours of the 25th with Package of Hooks & Eggs duly came to hand, and will for the last time warren you - when ever you will send ~~us~~ a grumbling letter again like the last - we will neither answer you or do your business - you seem to have found fault with the bill of the 25th which amounted to \$15.25 and of that you sent to us back 2.25 and the remainder of \$13.00 worth you do us a favor by keeping it - Now we want you to understand that every article in the \$13.00 we have bought for you - and therefore will warren you again not to trouble us with your orders as they will not be forwarded. - We have sent you all the goods which you ordered the 25th also the the 28th we have Inclosed you the Bill and receipt of Steamer dated 27th which you must have by this time in store or may not ~~have~~ reach you until the Otter arrives there, the steamers now are acting very bad towards shippers - they have all freight back and take passengers

accounts with others.
