Since October of last year, our executive have held six Board Meetings and have dealt with all phases of the operation. Through the Educational Committee, my thanks for obtaining services of Ben Rone, who is a very capable teacher and has accomplished a great deal with the children. Although this has been very expensive, it is my sincerest hopes that the new board would carefully consider any large increases over the amount spent this year for education.

One of the gratifying things of the year was the money raised by the B'Nai Brith with the cooperation of the members of the Synagogue, raised One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) for the Synagogue. This was handled through your President's Office, four trips were made to Vancouver, and during the three month period that these funds were raised, your President went to quite an expense. In view of the above, I would recommend that the One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) be used towards the purchase of a Safia Torah or anything considered not a normal expenditure, and not be put into the general funds of the Synagogue.

At this point, I would also point out that one of the hardest workers on this campaign was A. E. Alexander, and I would suggest that a plaque be placed in memory of A. E. Alexander for his many accomplishments during his term as President of the Congregation and his term as Honorary President.

This year, we have also adopted a new Constitution of By-Laws which has been distributed to all the members. This also was supplied at the expense of your President. I want to thank our Secretary for the many things she took care of during her term, not only this year, but for the past eight years that she has occupied this office, and I cannot help but comment on the fact that during her eight year term, the Congregation has never had to pay for any form of secretarial work, and I hope whoever holds the office from now on, will bear in mind that it is very simple to spend a considerable amount of money from time to time for the necessary correspondence involved in this position.

CEMETERY. The Cemetery has been taken care of also by our Secretary who spent a good many hours during the past four or five years in trying to maintain the gardens against many handicaps such as water pressure, the theft of various equipment from time to time, with the occasional vandalism that has occurred. This year, due to unfortunate deaths of two non-members of our Community, the Cemetery

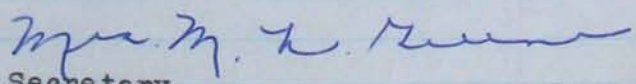

After the heroic period of Swedish cinema which ended with the sound film and the emigration to Hollywood of the greatest Swedish names - Sjostrom, Stiller, Barbo - practically nothing worthy of attention came out of Swedish studios, although a few films were made by the survivors of the heroic period, such as Gustav Edgren and Gustav Molander. A renaissance of the Swedish cinema began in the 'forties', with such films as Molander's ORDET (The Word) and THE EMPEROR OF PORTUGAL. Their success was an indication that Sweden was on the way to regaining its place in the art of the cinema. Then in 1944, Alf Sjöberg revealed himself with HETS (Torment) which was awarded a prize at the 1946 Cannes Festival.

ONE SUMMER OF HAPPINESS was made six years later in 1951, after the early Bergmans such as PORT OF CALL, PRISON, THIRST AND SUMMER INTERLUDE, and Sjöberg's MISS JULIE, but prior to the more recent Bergmans with which we are more familiar -- SAWDUST AND TINSEL, SMILES OF A SUMMER NIGHT, SEVENTH SEAL, WILD STRAWBERRIES, etc.

The Swedish cinema has always been noted for its use of exteriors. The sun, the sky, the snow, the fields share a common destiny with its characters. One gets at a Swedish film as at an open air concert, taking in gulps of fresh air, glancing at the sky, feeling the grass and occasionally listening to the music. But behind the tradition of the natural outdoors there is a tension, a constricting civilization that darkens the sun and the stars. One sees the struggle of a Christian, bourgeois culture (patriarchal and intensely puritanical) to oust an older pagan, patriarchal, peasant tradition in whose symbols and rituals survive many remnants of a fertility cult. Indeed the old rites would seem to have survived long enough to link up with the 'modern' freedom in sexual matters - ONE SUMMER OF HAPPINESS contrasts the joyfulness of the young lovers with the spiteful puritanism of the pastor.

The main theme of the film is a love story set in a contemporary rural setting. Goran, a youth from the city, goes to spend the summer at his uncle's farm. There he falls in love with a simple farm girl, Kerstin; a love which meets with violent disapproval from the girl's parents and the local "pillars of society". Interwoven with the main story is a sub-plot involving a puritanical minister who is attempting to fight what he considers the sinful tendencies of his congregation - dancing, games on the Sabbath, movies, plays, in short all the secular influences of the 20th Century.

The cameraman, Goran Strindberg, is the creative force behind the film. The photography is fabulous and captures the feeling of the Swedish countryside superbly. The musical score was awarded first prize at the 1952 Cannes Festival, though the leit-motiv which accompanies the appearances of the village simpleton is one of the less happy touches in the film. Ulla Jacobsson's performance is sensitive, suggesting at times an interior power not yet developed. (Notes for feature courtesy of Mrs. M. Waddington of the Vancouver Film Society.)
