The purpose of this letter is to introduce you to Yaletown House, a truly unique concept in residential care for seniors.

Yaletown House is a new 130-bed long term care facility opening in September, 1985 on B.C. Place site next to Expo. In addition to providing care for seniors, Yaletown House will be a specialized resource for older persons with neurological disorders such as Alzheimers disease. The building, which will be on view to the whole world during Expo 86, is being financed through Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation. The operating funding will be provided by the Province of British Columbia's Ministry of Health.
